Report on Foothill Gateway & East Bench: Master Plan

Wasatch Hollow Natural Open Space

Utah Conservation Corps working in the Hollow recently. They are doing some great work on improving the trails for the first phase portion which includes the lower meadow to the east of the creek, the Hollow entry from 1700 East, and the entry from Wasatch Hollow Park into Wasatch Hollow Open Space. They are also doing work on the short leg of trail that goes to the chain-link fence on the west side of the creek. This first phase of improving accessibility and stabilizing the creek banks will include reseeding, realigning existing trails, and some installation of fencing to protect sensitive areas of restoration. Some of the fencing will be temporary for periods of construction and other portions will be permanent according to the Final Plan. The area above the meadow will be undergoing extensive work throughout the spring and summer; the restoration above the meadow will not only provide much needed bank stabilization but fencing is necessary to

further protect the private properties on that side of the creek. In addition, new signs have been installed to remind visitors of on-leash ordinances; compliance of on-trail quidelines is especially important for successful restoration.

The contractors have been selected for the demolition of the house off Kensington and work will begin within three weeks. The actual deconstruction, grading around the home site, and hauling of materials will take 1-2 weeks.

We have been working on a list of volunteer events for the spring and summer and will soon release the final dates for Wasatch Hollow Open Space events. We're excited to tap into your very active community work. Partnerships and educational programs are also being planned with local schools.
