1. Closed Session ~4:30 p.m.

The Council will consider a motion to enter into Closed Session. A closed meeting described under Section 52-4-205 may be held for:

- a. discussion of the character, professional competence, or physical or mental health of an individual;
- b. strategy sessions to discuss collective bargaining;
- c. strategy sessions to discuss pending or reasonably imminent litigation;
- d. strategy sessions to discuss the purchase, exchange, or lease of real property, including any form of a water right or water shares, if public discussion of the transaction would:
 - (i) disclose the appraisal or estimated value of the property under consideration; or
 - (ii) prevent the public body from completing the transaction on the best possible terms;
- e. strategy sessions to discuss the sale of real property, including any form of a water right or water shares, if: (i) public discussion of the transaction would:
 - (A) disclose the appraisal or estimated value of the property under consideration; or
 - (B) prevent the public body from completing the transaction on the best possible terms;
 - (ii) the public body previously gave public notice that the property would be offered for sale; and
 - (iii) the terms of the sale are publicly disclosed before the public body approves the sale;
- f. discussion regarding deployment of security personnel, devices, or systems; and
- g. investigative proceedings regarding allegations of criminal misconduct. A closed meeting may also be held for attorney-client matters that are privileged pursuant to Utah Code § 78B-1-137

a) Training on Minimizing Use of Lethal Force

Legislative Sponsor: Luke Garrott the Police Department's record in avoiding and minimizing the use of lethal force and related training curriculum. The Council requested this briefing to ensure Salt Lake City Police officers are provided with adequate training to avoid and minimize the use of lethal force when encountering aggressive humans or animals.

b) <u>Sexual Assault Adjudication Process Improvements</u>

3. Amendments to Ground Transportation – Ride Sharing

Legislative Sponsor: Charlie Luke

The Council will be briefed on proposed changes to the City's ground transportation requirements, specifically relating to transportation network companies, such as Uber and Lyft, which use mobile internet applications to connect passengers with drivers. The proposal would

- eliminate current restrictions prohibiting non-taxicab operators from providing on-demand service (except at the Airport);
- eliminate requirements for a minimum and maximum number of ondemand taxicabs in the City; and
- · other changes.

4. Drive-Through Window Standards

Legislative Sponsor: Luke Garrott

The Council will receive a follow-up briefing relating to an ordinance amending the City's regulations for drive-through facilities. The proposed changes would address service accessibility by requiring that businesses with drive through windows allow bicyclists in drive throughs during all business hours. The proposed changes would affect Section 21A.40.060 – Drive-Through Facility Regulations and Title 5 - Business License Requirements, of the *Salt Lake City Code*. Related provisions of Title 21A – Zoning may also be amended as part of this petition. Petitioner Salt Lake City Council, Petition No. PLNPCM 2009-00169.
