1. Parks, Trails and Open Space Bond Initiative

Legislative Sponsor: Not Required - Council Priority
The Council will hold a follow-up discussion about options for a Parks,
Trails and Open Space Bond Proposal. If approved by voters, the
potential bond would result in a property tax increase for residents and
property owners and would be used to pay for more outdoor recreational
opportunities in the City – including converting some current open
spaces into new uses, adding trail improvements and connections, and
other opportunities. The Council will vote tonight to determine if the
bond will be placed on the November ballot.

2. Central Business Improvement Area Assessment, Downtown Alliance

Legislative Sponsor: Not Required-Council Priority
The Council will be briefed about a proposal to create a new assessment area for downtown Salt Lake City for economic promotion efforts. The current assessment area — and contract with a vendor — expire in April 2016. The proposal would enable the City to continue to collect assessment funds for marketing, advocacy and other initiatives in the Central Business Improvement Area. The Downtown Alliance is currently contracted to perform those duties. Under the proposal, the City would initiate a Request For Proposals from contractors to continue the promotional work. The Downtown Alliance could submit a proposal.

Legislative Sponsor: Not Required – Budget Item
The Council will continue to discuss the Mayor's recommended budget relating to the City's Capital Improvement Program (CIP) for Fiscal Year 2014-2015. Capital improvements involve the construction, purchase or renovation of buildings, parks, streets or other physical structures. Generally, projects have a useful life of five or more years and cost \$50,000 or more.

 - (ii) the public body previously gave public notice that the property would be offered for sale; and
 - (iii) the terms of the sale are publicly disclosed before the public body approves the sale;

- g. investigative proceedings regarding allegations of criminal misconduct. A closed meeting may also be held for attorney-client matters that are privileged pursuant to Utah Code § 78B-1-137, and for other lawful purposes that satisfy the pertinent requirements of the Utah Open and Public Meetings Act.

D. PUBLIC HEARINGS:

1. Ordinance – Zoning Text Amendments: Residential Mixed Use Districts

Legislative Sponsor: Not Required – Petition from Mayor Becker

Accept public comment and consider adopting an ordinance amending zoning regulations in the R-MU-35 and R-MU-45 Residential/Mixed Use zoning districts (amending Sections 21A.24.164, 21A.24.168 and 21A.46.090 of the Salt Lake City Code). The proposed changes would remove qualifying provisions for residential density, adjust required setbacks and lot standards, add design requirements and allow projecting signs in the R-MU-35 and R-MU-45 districts. Related provisions of Title 21A- Zoning may also be amended as part of this petition.

Petitioner – Mayor Ralph Becker, Petition No. PLNPCM2014-00127.

Staff Recommendation: Close and consider options.

2. Ordinance and Resolution: Budget Amendment No. 1 for Fiscal Year 2015-16

Legislative Sponsor: Not Required – Budget Related Items

Accept public comment and consider adopting an ordinance amending the final budget of Salt Lake City, including the employment staffing document for Fiscal Year 2015-16, , and consider adopting a resolution authorizing the approval an interlocal cooperation agreement between the City and County for management of the City's prosecutor office.

Budget amendments happen several times each year to reflect adjustments to the City's budgets, including proposed project additions and modifications.

3. Resolution: Mosquito Abatement Property Tax Changes

Legislative Sponsor: Not Required – Budget Related Items

Accept public comment and consider adopting a resolution approving the proposed tax increase in the property tax rate of the Salt Lake City Mosquito Abatement District. The revenue from the increase would be used to make facility improvements, improve surveillance and control methods, add technical personnel, and more.

Staff Recommendation: Close and consider options.

4. Resolution – Parks, Trails and Open Space Bond Initiative

Legislative Sponsor: Not Required – Council Priority

Continue to accept public comment and consider adopting a resolution calling a special bond election to authorize general obligation bonds in an amount not to exceed \$ for open space, parks, outdoor recreational facilities and community trails and related facilities.


