		Legislative Sponsor: Not Required – Regulatory Matter The Council will receive a written briefing on proposed changes to the City's wastewater pollutant standards. The changes are designed to better protect City facilities, the public and the environment. Wastewater from residences and industries is collected and treated at the Water Reclamation Facility and pollutant levels are regularly sampled and evaluated. Under the proposal, the maximum limits, known as Local Limits, for a number of pollutants per liter of wastewater would be changed.		
	2.	Special Events Ordinance Amendments	~2:00 p.m. 30 min.	
		Legislative Sponsor: Council Member Stan Penfold The Council will have a follow-up discussion regarding the proposed changes to the City's special events permitting process. The proposal would make the City's regulations more succinct; provide clarity about what constitutes small and large events; and creates a category for grandfathered events. The Council will also discuss insurance requirement options for special events, including a master City policy that would cover all events, or individual insurance policies event organizers would obtain on their own.
