**BACKGROUND:** As part of Ordinance 28 of 2013, the City Council adopted a revised Consolidated Fee Schedule, which establishes most City fees. This ordinance also requires that within a reasonable amount of time, the Administration identify and itemize all fees charged by the City by type, amount, specific source of authority to impose the fee, and the basis for calculating the fee. The Administration previously agreed with the Council to begin this process by focusing on fees charged by the Departments of Public Utilities and Community and Economic Development (CED), as well as the Special Events program.

We have completed our initial review of the fees for Public Utilities, CED and the Special Events Program and are providing an update on our progress. We are not proposing ordinance changes at this time, as additional work remains.

**DISCUSSION:** There was an in-depth review of all fees currently charged by Public Utilities, CED and Special Events. First, we gathered all the fees charged or that should be charged in these areas by reviewing existing ordinances, the CFE, contracts and

interviewing individuals in each area where fees were established. We then went through every fee currently charged to make sure that there was an ordinance that gives us the authority to charge the fees that exists. After this analysis was completed we put every fee into a category. The categories are as followed: Not on the CFS, Cost Analysis to be completed, New Fees, Incorrect Fees, Director can establish fees, Elimination of Fees, Ordinance- (none, re-write, or change), Errors on the CFS, Contractual, Preliminary Cost Justification and Rounding The attached document includes every fee charged, notes about the fee, ordinance references, and calculation details separated into these categories.

In addition, subsequent to two Utah Supreme Court cases: *V-1 Oil Company v. Utah State Tax Commission*, 942 P.2d 906, 911-912 (Utah 1996), *vacated on other grounds on reh'ing*; and *Tooele Associates Limited Partnership v. Tooele City Corporation*, 2011 UT 04; 247 P.3d 371. The Attorney's Office has offered additional guidance about the fee setting process. According to the Attorney's Office there are two major categories of municipal fees:

- 1. Service fees- a fee charged for a specific benefit.
- 2. Regulatory fees a fee that is charged for the actual cost of regulating and monitoring a class of entities.

Service fees must have a reasonable relationship to the service that is provided, or the benefit that is received. There does not have to be an exact mathematical correlation and the revenues from the fees may exceed the cost of providing the service as long as it remains reasonable.

Regulatory fees must have a reasonable relationship on the entire industry rather than a individual cost. A mathematical formula is not required, but the revenue from the fee cannot exceed the city's expenses by an unreasonable amount.

In both the attached spreadsheet and our analysis below, we have indicated where further work is needed to document our cost analysis for fees. In some cases, this cost analysis may result in a changed fee structure.

All of these areas need to be addressed, but we are going to currently focus on the three largest areas. These are, not on the CFS, Cost Analysis to be completed, and Director can establish fees.

- 1. Public Utilities
  - a. Not on the CFS We identified 42 fees that were not included in the CFS. Most of the fees that are not on the CFS for Public Utilities are those that are either set by contract or by the Director. We have evaluated both of these areas and have made recommendations based on our information as to what should be on the CFS.

- b. Cost Analysis There are 40 fees in Public Utilities that will need to be based on costs. 100% are either Contractual or Director set fees. Public Utilities has done a preliminary cost justification for the fees that are on the CFS.
- c. Director can establish fees Where it exists, we have provided specific references to statute and ordinance that delegate this responsibility to a Director.
- 2. CED
  - a. Not on the CFS All of the fees for CED are either Property Management or Sorenson Unity Center. These fees are small or may not have to be on the CFS based on the criteria that the Council set. None of these fees were in the ordinance.
  - b. Cost Analysis There are 41 fees in CED that will need to be based on costs. They are at a 50/50 split, with 50% not on the CFS and 50% set by contract. Most of these fees are Planning fees and have been around for a long period of time. CED has done some preliminary cost studies and we believe that these fees are below the actual costs.
  - c. CED Has no fees that are Director established.
- 3. Special Events Program
  - a. Not on the CFS Most of the fees for Special Events are not on the CFS, because they are written in ordinance as actual costs. We have spent several hours with the departments that are involved with the Special Event Program and they feel that these fees should be on the CFS.
  - b. Since these fees are not on the CFS they will all need to be cost justified before they are set as fees on the CFS.
  - c. There are no fees that are authorized by ordinance for the Director to establish.

I have attached the spreadsheet that backs up the information provided above. All departments have reviewed the spreadsheet. As you can see there are several fees that need to be cost justified.

#### **NEXT STEPS:**

The Administration proposes to complete an initial cost review of fees that we indicate need to be cost justified. If the initial review cannot justify the fees that are established, a direct or fully loaded cost analysis will have to be completed. While completing these

initial reviews the Finance Department will start the review process of fee for three other departments; Police, Fire and Finance. We plan to provide follow up information to the Council, which may include proposed ordinance changes, the early part of January.
